Information Specialists provide resource information to parents, guardians, school, the work place, and the community to support individuals with Autism Spectrum Disorders. We work one on one to assist families, guardians and individuals on the Autism Spectrum as they navigate child or adult services. We attend and participate in educational, transitional, and vocational planning meetings. We provide presentations and workshops regarding various topics to agencies and community organizations around the state.
